
What is EUFORGEN


Collaborative programme on forest genetic resources (FGR)

Financed by its member countries

Five-year Phases now Phase V 2015-19

Activities carried out on the basis of government-driven consensus





Mandate



Established in 1994 to implement a resolution of the first Ministerial Conference on the Protection of Forests in Europe



Contributes to the implementation of relevant decisions **CBD** decisions



implementation the Global Plan of Action for the Conservation, Sustainable Use and Development of Forest Genetic Resources adopted by the **FAO**





Preparatory action – EU plant and animal genetic resources

The aim was to provide the EU added value in the field of the conservation and sustainable use of genetic resources for food and agriculture

Preparatory action recommendations for GenRes research

- 6.Awareness raising for GenRes at consumer level











A. [2018]: Joining forces for GenRes and biodiversity management (CSA)

Activities will provide a framework in which the existing mosaic of European, national/regional structures can join forces to develop and implement ambitious approaches and strategies for the management of crop, forest and animal GenRes. In addition to advancing individual roadmaps, inventories and information tools for crop, forest and animal GenRes, cooperation between the different communities shall foster GenRes conservation within a wider (agro) biodiversity context. Particular care shall be taken to building and widening capacities across Europe and neighbouring countries (including Mediterranean countries), exchanging best practices, harmonising standards as well as sharing resources and data.

GenRes Bridge Objectives

increase the **effectiveness of sustainable management** for crop, forest and animal GenRes

widen capacities to increase the **knowledge on conserved diversity** of crop, forest and animal GenRes

enhance the conservation status of GenRes

improve the **services** offered to the endusers of GenRes



GenRes Bridge key elements

Develop integrated conservation strategies for (forest, animal and crop) genetic resources in Europe

to start on 1 January 2019 and last 3 years

Present outcomes at high-level policy events









EUFORGEN contribution to GenRes Bridge

Established a working group to support the development of the integrated conservation strategies (FGR)

Long-term **monitoring** implementation of conservation strategy
