



Merinolandschaf / Württemberger Sheep

- ☐ Origin: The Merino Land Sheep (Württemberger sheep) originate through improvement with purebred Merinos in Southern and Central Germany in the 19th century.
- □ Breed description: The large framed white sheep has a wedged, long head and a typical forelock and broad slightly hanging ears. The white wool has merino fibre with 26 28 microns.
- ☐ Special performance: breeding of a robust sheep with best adaptation on walking long distances. Most suitable for countryside preservation with high performance in different production intensities. Good carcass results, high fertility and unseasonal breeding with good mothering.





Merinolangwollschaf / Merino Longwool Sheep

- ☐ Origin:The Merino longwool sheep was originated by a combination of the breeds Württemberger sheep, North Caucasian meat sheep, Corriedale and Lincoln after 1971.
- □ Breed description: The medium-framed to framed, white sheep is long, deep and well muscled. The white, long combable and dense wool has merino character with 28 32 microns. Head, upper arm and belly show a sufficient amount of wool.
- □ Special performance: Breeding an adaptable and robust sheep suitable for year-round grazing and pen keeping. The breed is ready for conception all year round, fertile, precocious and diligently growing up with good mothering.

Merinofleischschaf / Merino mutton Sheep

- ☐ Origin: The Merino mutton sheep was originated through a combination of the German Merino wool sheep with French and English dual purpose breeds in the 19th century .
- ☐ Breed description: The medium-sized to large white sheep is long, deep and well muscled. The fine, white and dense wool has merino character with 22 28 microns. The head with a distinct sex type is medium in size, broad and woolly to the eye line.
- ☐ Special performance:Breeding of an efficient, excellently muscled meat sheep, especially suitable for areas where feed is abundant. Conception all year round, fertile, precocious and diligently growing up with good mothering.
