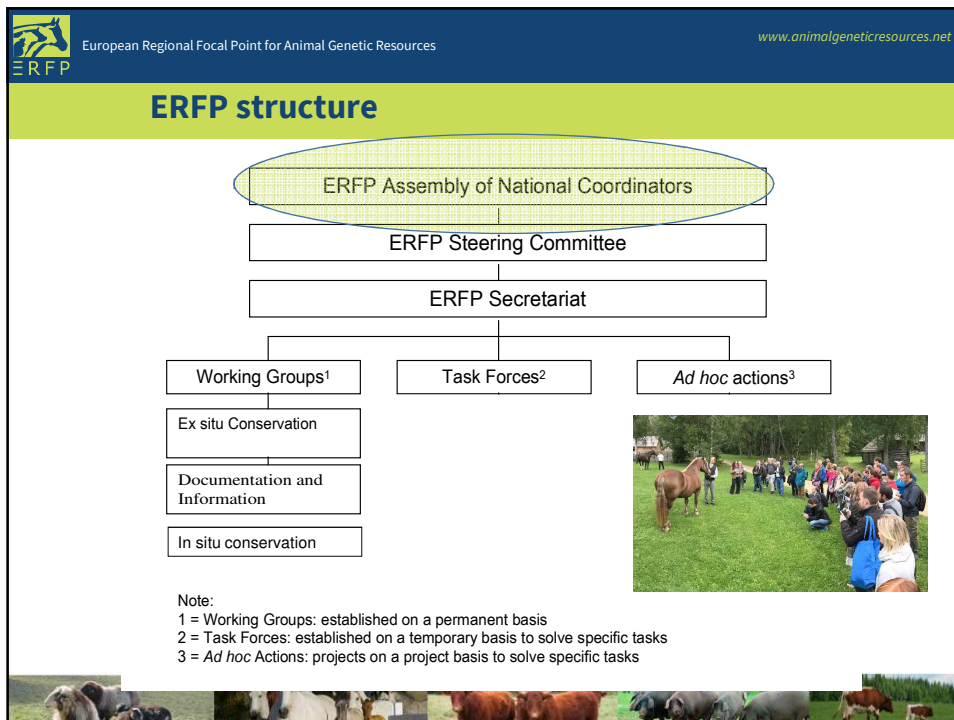


National coordinators

- Officially nominated by their countries (usually through the Ministry of Agriculture) to the CGRFA
- List of countries 
- At ERFP level, countries can nominate
 - ✓ NC alternate = technical point of view
 - ✓ Technical advisors (General Assembly)

- Fixed annual budget
- ✓ Travel costs
- ✓ Publication of reports
- ✓ Other actions

Ad hoc actions

- Decided by SC (project, workshop, meeting) to solve specific short term problems
- Project proposals **submitted by NC** and evaluated by SC
- Outcome: Increased collaboration within/between countries
- Output: reports (reviews and guidelines on relevant topics)
- Also a platform to initiate EU projects
